6259 Days Cove Road, off 11400 block Pulaski Highway, one block east of Allender Road

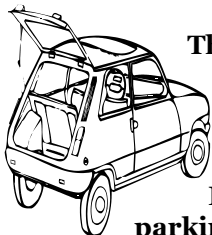

Double Parking is Against the Law! Alleyways are not parking areas



The residents of Hawthorne ask that when visitors need to "drop off" someone or something to a home that they use the open parking spaces available. Under Baltimore County law, double parking in a residential area is a fineable offence and will be enforced by the police. Parking on corners, in alleyway entrances and disabled access areas are also fineable offences.

MyNeighborhood provides viewable data about your neighborhood

The My Neighborhood application is an interactive map which enables users to search for locations by an address or tax account number, identify features such as zoning designations, find additional information related to data, link to Real Property (tax assessment) information, topographic data, view aerial photography, measure distances and print maps.
